BC Winter Games: Wheelchair Basketball

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Lavington Elementary has been selected to be an accommodation site for the BC Winter Games which will take place here in Vernon between **March 22**nd and **26**th.

SD#22 is a main partner of the games and will welcome approximately 1800 athletes, coaches, and officials both to our city, and more significantly, to eight of our district school sites for an extended weekend of competition across a range of sports.

Athletes

- Emerging high-performance athletes
- Age range 9-18 years depending on the sport
- Average age of 14.5
- Athletes with a disability included in select sports

Here at Lavington Elementary, we will be housing close to 80 guests and the people tasked with coordinating and implementing this task need many volunteers to make it work.

Volunteers

Volunteers are the driving force and heart and soul of the BC Games. Each volunteer is committed to ensure that the community comes together in a celebration of pride and that participants have an unforgettable experience. From meal preparation, to transportation, to hospitality, and sport competitions, the enthusiasm and expertise of volunteers is what makes it all happen.

Accommodation Directorate:

We are hoping that we can help the games be successful at the accommodation level, in other words on the ground, right here in our school by attracting the number of volunteers needed for Lavington from our own community.

Check below for ways you and your family could help:

Accommodation-Dorm Management Volunteers are the Accommodation Attendants that will staff the dorm desk, check participants in, monitor accommodations processes and provide information on the school layout to participants residing in the schools. Anyone like graveyard shifts? We need coverage 24/7!!

Accommodation-Hospitality Volunteers will serve as additional Accommodation Attendants during the evening stationed in the hospitality or social spaces at each school to service the distribution of snacks and provision of minor games/activities throughout the evening.

Accommodation-Housekeeping Volunteers will support Accommodations Attendants with minor cleaning and sanitization rounds of high touch surfaces.

Accommodation-Site Preparation Volunteers will serve as the set-up (Wednesday evening) and take-down crew (Sunday afternoon/evening) They help convert schools to accommodations sites and then return them afterwards.

Accommodation-Hold Area Volunteers is a special shift of 8-12 Accommodation Attendants that will staff and service a holding area space at the Vernon Recreation Centre from approximately 11:00-3:00 PM (TBD) Sunday, March 26 to provide space and minor services for participants waiting for charter flights home.

All Accommodations volunteers (except Site Prep) require proof of vaccination expectations and Criminal Record Checks. Speak to Accommodations Director/Chair leaders about Criminal Record Check processes for current district employees.

An Accommodation Volunteer Management Chair will contact you for additional screening and school or shift scheduling preference. At this point Volunteers can be scheduled to a school site of their choice.

Pacific Assistance Dog Program (P.A.D.S)

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This letter is to inform you that we will be welcoming the Pacific Assistance Dog (PADS) program to our school as part of a school community project. Pacific Assistance Dogs (PADS) are in training to become support dogs to individuals who have disabilities. As an approved PADS Sitter, Ellie Jensen our School Based Resource Teacher, will be working with the program to help build the foundation for training and socialization. Puppy sitters care for and train puppies in the program for a period of 6 months to one and a half years.

PADS puppies are carefully selected at 8 weeks old to be part of the program based on parents who are healthy and temperamentally sound. Puppies are specifically selected based on submissive and confident temperaments and are dogs who love people and the world around them. As part of the program, these puppies are legally certified to accompany Puppy Raisers and Sitters everywhere, including work, school, sporting events, restaurants, movies, etc. The goal is to include these puppies in day-to-day activities that they may participate in as an Assistance Dog in future.

All staff in the building have shared their support in this being a community initiative. Teachers will be providing instruction using the Be A Tree Doggone Safety Program, so all students have confidence in approaching the PADS dog in our school, and strange dogs within the broader community. Should you have any questions or concerns related to PADS dogs being in the school with your child, please contact Nigel Maccagno, Principal who would be happy to seek out further information as needed.
